#### Introduction

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Thank you for the opportunity to submit on the Waikato Regional Councils proposed Plan Change 1.

My name Andrew Clark. Since 1992 we have farmed 54 ha on the southeastern slopes of Mt Pirongia. The property is near the headwaters of two mountain streams, the Mangarewarewa and the other un-named. Until 2013 I farmed the property myself running dairy heifers and a few beef cattle of our own. The number of stock carried gradually increased as fertility improved and we were usually running between 18 and 24 SU/HA depending on the number of heifers my client had available. All supplement was made on farm (approx.. 160-180 bales of haylage). In 2013 ,for health reasons, we leased the farm on 3 by 3 year lease to two neighbours as a grazing lease with myself still being responsible for maintenance, fertilizer and fencing. The farm is divided 8 ha/39 ha between the lessees.

Most of the streams are fenced off from stock access with the rest being done as finance allows. There are three small patches of native bush which used to be under a Waipa Valley Authority covenant but are now under QE 2. Some other areas have been fenced off too and allowed to regenerate in native trees with some additional planting as well.

Until recent years we used RPR fertilizer with minimal amounts of added urea mixed with it. Unfortunately the supply of RPR is now unreliable so we are having to use processed fertilizer. Urea has never been used by itself.

No further development is planned under the current ownership.
